- Internships that offer practical experience in the analysis of environmental problems and the quest for sustainable solutions of local and global issues
- Affiliation agreements that provide opportunities for hands-on experience in Alaska, Costa Rica, the Caribbean Basin, the Eastern Mediterranean, and Australia
- Joint degree programs, including a 3/2 B.A./B.S. and 4/2 B.A./M.S. in partnership with Columbia University's Krumb School of Earth and Environmental Engineering
