

BIO 485/630: Field Paleontology May 30-June 8, 2017, Utah

Both undergraduate & graduate students from any higher-ed institution are invited to take a 2-credit, 10-day immersion course in field paleontology, where they will travel to Utah to excavate dinosaur bones and footprints to learn a variety of paleontological methods including excavation, mapping, comparative anatomy, and paleoenvironmental reconstruction. Students will stay at the Capitol Reef National Park Field Station and visit other local National Parks to unravel the geologic and evolutionary history of the region.
