Scenarios USA is a non-profit organization that uses writing and film to foster youth leadership, advocacy and self-expression in students from across the county, with a focus on under-represented communities. In 15 years, Scenarios has engaged over 100,000 students in addressing issues shaping

As you are aware, bullying in schools is a very big problem today. As a child, the very talented Ms. O'Connor performed in many theater productions, and was rather tall and thin growing up. She did not have time for or interest in sports and most other things that typical children spend time on.

Therefore, she was perceived as "different" by the other kids, and she suffered serious bullying, both physical, verbal, and online. Like many victims of abuse, she did not report the bullying, erroneously thinking that she somehow deserved it.

Later, at the age of 14, Meredith was discovered by a modeling scout, and the thing that made her different and a target, (being tall and thin), became the basis for a career. Meredith pursued work in modeling, then music, which led to her meeting Manager Rick Galvin, and she is now quite a successful singer/songwriter and actress.

Remembering how it felt to be bullied led Meredith to write music for the victims of bullying, to inspire them to believe that they can and will survive the bullying, and that things will get better. Her songs and performances promote inclusion and tolerance among young people.

Meredith visits schools and camps around the country, performing her music and talking to students about overcoming having been bullied for being "different". Her fans include both boys and girls, and her audience is all ages, but particularly focuses on middle school aged kids
