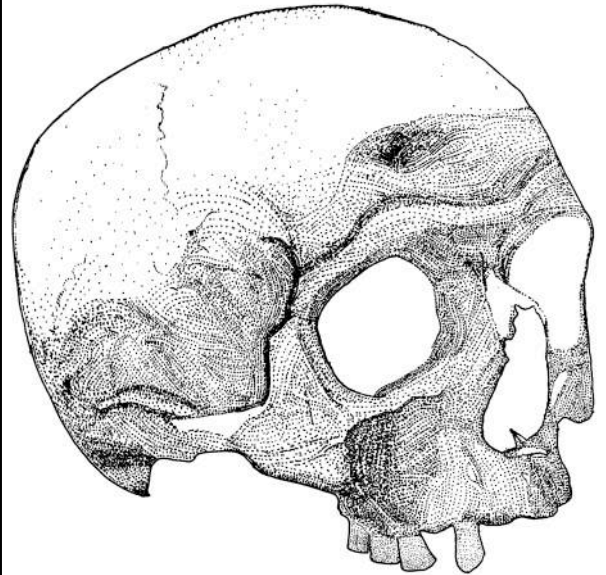

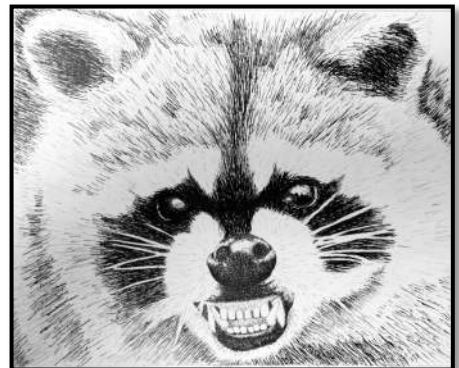

**Professors Anagnostis and Argie Agelarakis** will be in Crete, Greece, teaching their summer field school courses in Bio-archaeology and continuing to research the Neolithic and Late Bronze Age Aposolemis sites, conducting site and cave explorations, while continuing the longstanding ethno-botanical research project.

This summer, **Professors Krasinski and Wygal** will be leading three separate multidisciplinary research projects in different parts of the Alaska wilderness. These projects will explore adaptations of prehistoric Alaska and will involve students representing universities from around the United States, Canada, and France. We look forward to bringing interesting artifacts, experiences, and research projects back to Adelphi University students working in the Archaeology Laboratory.

**Hanna Kim:** "I am looking forward to the completion of my book manuscript! This will be the first book-length ethnography on the Bochasanwasi Shri Akshar Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS), an extensive Hindu diaspora community originating in western India. I will be doing fieldwork in several Gulf States (Bahrain, Dubai), east African states (Uganda and Tanzania), and Gujarat State in India as I fill in some gaps in data for the book. My research is funded in part by a grant from the American Philosophical Society."

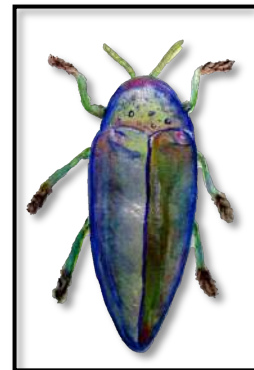
