Homemade Applesauce

Recently, many children have been sharing their weekend stories about going apple picking with their families. Some children have even brought in apples to share with their friends. At meeting time we have been reading non-fiction books to learn more about the various types of apple as well as the process of apple picking. During our discussions we spoke about the many ways we can use apples in cooking and baking. Based on our conversations we decided to make our own homemade applesauce!



Hailey, Julia, Ashley and Tegan were anxious to help. They discussed how they thought we could make applesauce. Hailey suggested that we have to "mush" the apples. Ashley stated: We have to take the skin off. Tegan and Julia added: We have to cook the apples. So we did some research to find a recipe.

First we needed to gather the ingredients. We needed apples, sugar, cinnamon, lemon and water. We also had to get a bowl, mixing spoons, a crockpot and our apple peeler tool.



Peeling the apples...



Ashley used the apple peeler to remove the skin from the apples. As she turned the crank she stated: The skin looks so curly.

As **Tegan** observed the skin peeling off the apple she stated: It reminds me of an onion. As Gina removed the apple from the apple peeler tool, **Hailey** stated: Look, there's the core! **Christopher** noticed that the apple core had seeds inside.





Next, **Julia** and **Hailey** used the plastic knives to carefully cut the apples into small pieces. Adding the ingredients...



Julia added the $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of cinnamon.



Sophia added 1 cup of water.

After all the apples were cut, we placed them into a bowl. Now it was time to add the rest of the ingredients. Hailey added the $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of sugar.



Ashley squeezed 1 tablespoon of lemon juice to add to the mixture.
