#### What Nonprofit Leaders Talk About

At the Center for Nonprofit Leadership, September means the beginning of our Executive Roundtable series. The roundtables offer a convivial space for nonprofit leaders to discuss fundraising, board governance, programs, strategies and new ideas for reaching more people. It's also a place to vent frustrations and seek feedback for current challenges. This issue of LeadTime explores some of the topics addressed at roundtable discussions.

#### The New Lifecycle of Work

Frances Kunreuther, Director of the Building Movement Project, coauthored a recent article about the future plans of retiring longterm nonprofit leaders. The article is based on responses from 266 full-time nonprofit leaders, 55 years and older to a 2012 online survey. The authors suggest that:

- Aging nonprofit leaders need help navigating the exit from their current positions.
- Organizations should take advantage of experienced leaders who are seeking ways to use their skills to solve social problems and promote the common good.

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#### The New Lifecycle of Work

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#### Is the Next Generation Ready to Lead?

CompassPoint surveyed 5,754 members of Idealist.org and constituents of CompassPoint Nonprofit Services. The respondents ranged in age from under 20 to over 60, and worked in the private, public, and nonprofit sector. All of the respondents had either considered or had worked in a nonprofit. None served as executive director. The survey asked about (1) what drew them to charitable work, (2) the disadvantages and benefits of heading a nonprofit organization, (3) did the respondents aspire to become executive directors one day, and (4) if they didn't, what might change their minds? Here are some of the findings:

- One in three respondents aspires to be an executive director someday
- A higher percentage of respondents who definitely aspire to become executive directors are people of color
- Of respondents who do aspire to become executive directors, 40% reported that they are ready either now or will be within five years
