ADELPHI UNIVERSITY CHI POLL

The Adelphi University Center for Health Innovation (CHI) Poll is a proprietary survey of Adelphi's Center for Health Innovation. This survey focused on mental health issues and the results were released at the February 12, 2013 CHI Inaugural Symposium, "Assuring the Continuum of Care in Emergency Situations." The results reflect the responses to an online survey of a national sample of 100 mental health professionals, defined as psychologists, psychiatrists, LICSWs, LISWs and CSW-Cs.

Key Takeaways from the Adelphi University CHI Poll Results

A community disaster refers to both man-made (such as a school shooting) and natural (such as a hurricane) events—and can strike at any moment. Yet nearly half of mental health professionals in the Northeast (48 percent), South (48 percent) and West (46 percent) feel their community's mental health system is unprepared for a community disaster, compared to 41 percent of the country overall. Midwesterners feel differently—only 21 percent say their community's system is unprepared.

Emergency Preparedness Lacking: When a disaster or emergency hits a community, mental health treatment is often disrupted. To avoid this, mental health professionals should plan ahead, but many do not. Ninety-two percent of these professionals don't have a clinical will in place in case of an emergency. Further, 82 percent haven't discussed a contingency plan with their clients and 65 percent haven't discussed alternative ways for clients to reach them. The list continues: More than half (52 percent) don't have referrals available in case they're unreachable and nearly half (46 percent) haven't backed up their files digitally.

Poll Methodology: The Adelphi University CHI Poll was conducted by Wakefield Research (wakefieldresearch.com) among 100 mental health professionals, defined as psychologists, psychiatrists, LICSWs, LISWs and CSW-Cs, between January 25 and February 4, 2013, using an email invitation and an online survey.
