

## Phi Theta Kappa Select Award

Terms & Conditions

NEW YORK

- 1. To be eligible for Adelphi University's Phi Theta Kappa Select Award for the **2024-2025** academic year and beyond, you need to meet the requirements listed below. Please note, this award only applies to your Fall and Spring semesters of study.
  - Enroll in full-time study at Adelphi University with a minimum of twelve (12) credits **per semester**, pursuing a bachelor's degree;
  - Successfully complete a minimum of 18 credits each academic year in your program of study (be cautious, failures and withdrawals may impact successful completion);
  - Maintain a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 throughout each academic year while pursuing your bachelor's degree at Adelphi University;
  - Participate in campus and/or community programs (during your first semester, you will receive information from the Division of Student Affairs explaining how to meet these requirements);
- 2. The amount of your award is fixed and won't change, regardless of any future changes in tuition and fees, or your academic performance during your enrollment at Adelphi University.
- 3. The total of your scholarships cannot exceed the tuition and fees at Adelphi University.
  - If the combination of your awards and other resources exceeds these costs, the University reserves the right to adjust your previously awarded financial assistance.
    - This includes but is not limited to factors like Veterans educational benefits, external awards, and federal and state scholarships and grants.
- 4. Undergraduate scholarships and grants are typically awarded for full-time enrollment. However, the University may waive the full-time enrollment requirement in cases of qualifying disabilities, as determined by the Student Access Office. For details on this waiver and prorated scholarships, please reach out to the One-Stop Student Services Center.
- 5. Students enrolled in contractual programs with discounted tuition may not qualify for Adelphi University's scholarships and grants. Before changing your major or program, contact the One-Stop Student Services Center to discuss any financial implications.
- 6. If you're a **U.S. citizen or permanent resident** with a scholarship, it's advised to annually file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with the U.S. Department of Education, even if you don't expect financial assistance. After filing, Adelphi's One-Stop Student Services Center will provide a College Financing Plan (CFP) outlining your costs. Your award may be adjusted based on eligibility for federal, state, and institutional aid.
- 7. Adelphi reserves the right to revoke this award based on academic or behavioral violations.
