Be Aware of the Symptoms

- A lump or swelling, which is usually painless
- Skin dimpling or puckering
- Nipple pain
- Nipple retraction (turning inward)
- Redness or scaling of the nipple or breast ckin
- Discharge from the nipple

Our dedicated volunteer, Timothy Hott, was recently interviewed for an article in The Herald. Diagnosed with breast cancer in 2020 at the age of 71, Timothy shares a powerful message for other men: **"No one should die of embarrassment. If you see**

something, get it checked. Breast cancer is not just a women's issue—it's a health issue that affects us all."



The STEP Program

The Adelphi NY Statewide Breast Cancer Hotline & Support Program was <u>awarded a significant five-year grant</u> from the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u> to initiate the **Survivorship**, **Treatment**, **Education and Peer Support (STEP) Program** which provides psychosocial support services and referrals to improve the quality of life for young women diagnosed with breast cancer, MBC patients and their families.

The STEP Program also provides educational workshops and forums, provider education and a video series.



This November, we're proud to share our latest STEP Program video featuring **Diana Tjaden**, a dedicated physical therapist who highlights the vital role of physical therapy in breast cancer recovery. In this informative presentation, Diana explains how early intervention can ease pain, improve mobility, and support healing after surgery and treatment. Her insights underscore the importance of education, collaboration, and patient empowerment—reminding us that recovery encompasses not only physical healing, but emotional and community support as well.



In honor of National Family Caregivers Month this November, we're proud to share Kim and Anthony's story—a powerful testament to love, resilience, and the vital role of caregivers in the cancer journey. When Kim was diagnosed with stage two invasive ductal carcinoma at just 30 years old, Anthony became not only her partner but her unwavering source of strength and comfort. Together, they navigated the uncertainty of treatment, learning to face each day with courage, hope, and gratitude. Their story reminds us that no one should face breast cancer alone and that the support of loved ones can make all the difference on the path to healing.




