

### A4.1.3 NYC Public Schools Hiring Report Analysis

#### *External Validation of Employer Satisfaction for Advanced Programs*

#### Overview

The NYC Public Schools Office of Teacher Recruitment and Quality (TRQ) 2025 Hiring Report provides external, third-party validation of employer satisfaction with Adelphi University program completers. This data supplements the EPP's direct employer surveys by offering large-scale hiring district perspectives on graduate preparedness. The report includes New Teacher Survey results that directly address CAEP RA4.1 criteria for employer satisfaction with completer preparation.

#### Hiring Data Summary: Advanced Programs

In the 2025-2026 hiring season, 110 Adelphi graduates were hired through traditional pathways in NYC Public Schools, representing a **28% increase** from the prior year (86 hires in 2024-2025). The following table shows hires in advanced program certification areas:

Note: NYC did not provide disaggregated data by initial vs. advanced for two program sets: Childhood (initial)/Early Childhood (advanced) and Physical Education (initial and advanced).

#### Employer Satisfaction: New Teacher Survey Results

The NYC Public Schools New Teacher Survey provides employer-perspective data on program effectiveness. Survey respondents (N=53) rated their preparation across multiple dimensions:

The New Teacher Survey specifically addresses preparation to work with diverse student populations and families, directly meeting CAEP RA4.1 requirements:

## Workforce Diversity Indicators

The report provides additional context on program completers' contributions to workforce diversity and high-need settings:

- **32%** of Adelphi new hires identify as persons of color

- **83%** of graduates were hired in priority (high-need) districts
- **81.9%** of applicants were deemed eligible for hire by NYCPS
- **93%** agreement that student teaching prepared graduates for first year (Strongly Agree + Agree)
