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
Meet and Greet 2020

Clinical Preceptor Spotlight: Pam Geiger, Au.D.

Pam Geiger, Au.D. is a staff audiologist at the Brooklyn VA Medical Center, part of the New York Harbor Health Care System of the Veteran's Administration for the last 12 years. Dr. Geiger is a NYS licensed audiologist and hearing aid dispenser and has been providing audiological services for 25 years. She received her Bachelors Degree in Speech Pathology and Audiology as well as her Masters Degree in Audiology from Brooklyn College. She later received her Doctor of Audiology degree from A.T. Still University- Arizona School of Health Sciences in 2005.



Dr. Geiger has worked in various settings during her career. Her first audiology job was at The Center for Communication and Hearing (formally The League for the Hard of Hearing) where she worked with an outstanding team of audiologists and experienced all of the aspects of caring for hearing impaired people which included: adult and pediatric audiology, ENT services, social work, psychology, job assistance and speech pathology all contained in one agency. While her children were school aged she consulted for 7 years in various settings which included: ENT practices, Manhattan and East Orange VA, Elizabeth Seton Children's Center (formally The NY Foundling Hospital) and clinical supervisor at Brooklyn College. In addition, over the years she has been an adjunct professor at Brooklyn College teaching both undergraduate and graduate audiology classes. She has also presented at The American Academy of Audiology (AAA) convention in the past. Dr. Geiger is herself, hearing impaired and a hearing aid user. She uses this asset to counsel and comfort her patients and to give a different perspective to the students that she supervises. She has a genetic hearing loss since birth and functions well with hearing aids. She feels that her hearing loss has given her different tools to offer her patients as well as a lifetime of experience on communication strategies which she incorporates into her counseling. She supervises students from the three local programs, Long Island, CUNY and Montclair State and enjoys watching the students grow towards becoming independent audiologists. Dr. Geiger is married to her husband for 29 years and they have two grown children. In her free time she enjoys traveling, spending time with family and friends and going to concerts


